Jody W. Ogle serves as a Supervisory Cybersecurity Advisor for the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency's (CISA) Integrated Operations Division staff within region 3. His area of responsibility includes Pennsylvania and West Virginia. He previously served as the CISA State Cyber Coordinator for West Virginia where he provided strategic advice to senior officials within the state and local governments. As a Supervisory Cybersecurity Advisor, he manages a team of regionally based State Cyber Coordinators and Cybersecurity Advisors serving federal, state, local, and private partners. His team primarily focuses on pre-incident cybersecurity preparedness activities offering strategic consultation and a wide range of no-cost services with the goal to build resilience across all sixteen sectors of critical infrastructure. He is a lifelong resident of West Virginia and a graduate of Marshall University.



He is a twenty-seven-year veteran of the United States Air Force and West Virginia Air National Guard where he is currently a Cyber Operations Officer, the Senior Cyber Policy Advisor, and the Air Staff Communications Director. Beginning his career at the lowest level of the enlisted ranks, he currently holds the rank of Colonel and is fully joint qualified. Prior to transitioning to CISA fulltime, he served as the Chief Information Officer (J6) for the West Virginia National Guard where he provided full scope strategic informational and technical oversight for more than 6,000 Soldiers and Airmen. He has completed two deployments to USCENTCOM and USAFRICOM as well as tour at USCYBERCOM where he helped author the first concept of operations on the use of National Guard forces for domestic cyber response, specifically electoral security.

He holds a Bachelor's degree in software engineering and a Master's Degree in Information Technology Management. He is a graduate of the National Defense University, the Air War College, the Air Command and Staff College, and the Harvard Kennedy School's Leadership in Homeland Security course. Among several he holds the (ISC)² Certified Information Systems Security Professional and the ISACA Certified Information Security Manager certifications.

Across more than twenty years of experience as a technology professional, he has worked in the private sector and for multiple agencies within the West Virginia State and Federal governments.

Finally, he is an adjunct professor within Marshall University's College of Science.
